

Science

In science, we are learning that animals and plants belong to kingdoms along with protists, bacteria and fungi. Choose either an animal or a plant and **create an information booklet about them.**

Think about which kingdom they belong to, whether they are an invertebrate or vertebrate and which species they are. Collate interesting facts and use diagrams to show you have learnt.



Art

Use the internet to search for pictures of the artefacts found at the Sutton Hoo burial site, such as The Franks casket, belt buckle, purse lid and shoulder clasp. **Create a piece of Anglo-Saxon art using the designs on the artefacts as inspiration**



History

Research Anglo-Saxon homes. What features did they have? Where did their animals sleep? Did they have doors and windows? Did they have a bathroom? Did they have a garden? What were their houses made of? How were they built?

Demonstrate through pictures how Anglo-Saxon houses differed from our own.

Science
